

Major Keys






Flats

If you can remember everything is just “5” letter names away, all you have to remember is the letter “C”. Once you have “C”, go 5 letter names to the left and add 1 flat. The order of flats start with “B \flat ”.

Sharps

If you can remember everything is just “5” letter names away, all you have to remember is the letter “C”. Once you have “C”, go 5 letter names to the right and add 1 sharp. The order of sharps start with “F \sharp ”.



Minor Keys

Remember the minor key is 3 letter names below the major




Flats

If you can remember everything is just "5" letter names away, all you have to remember is the letter "a". Once you have "a", go 5 letter names to the left and add 1 flat. The order of flats start with "B \flat ".



Sharps

If you can remember everything is just "5" letter names away, all you have to remember is the letter "a". Once you have "a", go 5 letter names to the right and add 1 sharp. The order of sharps start with "F \sharp ".
